Our History



THEN

St Francis Xavier College is a co-educational secondary school that has served the Belconnen region for over 46 years. It opened on our site in Florey in 1976 with an initial enrolment of 74 students.

In 2001, St Francis Xavier expanded to become a College and our first Year 12 students graduated in 2002.

Since then, there has been an increase in our student population and St Francis Xavier,
a 15th century missionary and his life, work and legacy continue to inspire our story and mission.



St Francis Xavier College is situated on a 9-hectare site in the heart of Belconnen.

The College building programme has been ongoing since the late 1990s and will continue into the future to ensure that through modifications, refurbishments and new building projects, our students have access to state of the art facilities. Each area of the College, Academics, Sport and the Creative Arts inform our Master planning as it continues into the future. The college responds to new initiatives and improvements in unique and purposeful ways, ensuring that our students are able to learn in spaces that foster their achievement and success.

Junior School Year 7

In Year 7 our students are carefully transitioned into secondary school.

The learning programme in Year 7 follows the Learning Areas endorsed by the Australian Curriculum, including English, Mathematics, Science, Technologies, Humanities and the Social Sciences, the Arts, Languages and Health and PE.

As a Catholic school, our students also study Religious Education. The Humanities and Mathematics and Science programmes are integrated in Year 7.

Years 8, 9 and 10

Senior School

Our senior curriculum is designed to prepare students for their post school pathways, including university, CIT and the workforce. Students are offered a challenging and diverse subject choice in their senior years from a wide range of subjects endorsed by the Board of Senior Secondary Studies (BSSS), as well as opportunities to undertake nationally accredited vocational courses. Students are supported in their learning by highly skilled teachers of senior studies as well as a Director of Senior Studies and Coordinator of Data Analytics who track their learning trajectory and provide guidance, support and advice.

All subjects contribute to the award of a Senior Secondary Certificate and for those seeking an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR), the College offers a broad range of subjects to support this pathway. Those students who elect not to pursue an ATAR may undertake a school-based apprenticeship.

Instrumental Music

Our Music programme is exceptional. In addition to classroom music tuition which begins in Year 7, students may also elect to participate in our extensive instrumental programme.

Specialist tutors are available on site to provide individual and small group tuition in voice, strings, woodwind, brass, keyboard and percussion. Our students have the opportunity to pursue their musical passions through one of our two concert bands, brass, woodwind and percussion ensembles, choirs or rock bands, and to display their learning and talent at festivals, eisteddfods and concerts.





Musical

Our biennial production is one of the highlights of the College year.

Students from Year 7 to 12 are invited to participate in our musical production as members of the cast, crew or in sound and lighting. The musical is always a showcase of our student talent in music, drama and dance.



Sport

Sport is an integral part of life at St Francis Xavier College. Students are encouraged to be involved in a diverse range of sporting activities in addition to studying PE and Health. The College has a strong sporting culture and enjoys huge successes in representative sport. Students participate in a wide range of organised ACT sports events throughout the year.
