A STRONG START IN YEAR 7 HUMANITIES

Term 1 is always an exciting and important time as we get to know our new Year 7 students, and this year's cohort has made a very positive start to their secondary Humanities journey. Students have arrived with enthusiasm, curiosity and a willingness to engage with new ideas, skills and ways of thinking. It has also been a pleasure to welcome several new staff members to the Humanities team, and I would like to acknowledge Mel Lenarcic, Lily Holloway, Izaac Green and Talia Howard, who have settled in quickly and brought an energy, care and expertise to their classrooms and our growing Humanities team.

Across Humanities and Social Sciences, students have been developing key historical skills as they explore the deep time history of Australia alongside the study of ancient societies. Through historical inquiry and source work, students have begun thinking like historians, asking questions, analysing evidence and considering how the past is interpreted. Many students have demonstrated strong engagement with discussions around Australia's First Nations histories and have shown growing confidence as they transition into their next unit on Ancient Rome.



In English, students commenced the year with the Voices of Change unit, where they explore texts that advocate for women's empowerment. Through the study of persuasive speeches from our past students have practiced analysing language and persuasive techniques, while also developing their own ability to express ideas clearly and respectfully. It has been encouraging to see students thoughtfully engaging with historical voices and making connections to contemporary discussions about equality and social change.

YEAR 7 HUMANITIES CONTINUED

In Religious Education, students have been reflecting on what it means to belong to a community through the unit Our History, Our Journey. By learning about the traditions, values and practices of Catholic communities, including the life and legacy of St Francis Xavier, students have explored how faith shapes identity and purpose. These lessons have also provided valuable opportunities for students to reflect on their own transition into secondary school and the ways they are finding connection and belonging within the wider school community through shared experiences and College traditions.

Overall, Term 1 has been a strong foundation for the year ahead. We are proud of the way our Year 7 students have embraced new challenges, collaborated with their peers and begun developing the skills and confidence that will support their learning across Humanities subjects and within the broader College.

YEAR 7 MATHS AND SCIENCE

The beginning of the school year has been an exciting time for our Year 7 STEM learners as they have settled into their study of Mathematics and Science at High School.

In Mathematics, students have been revisiting and strengthening their understanding of Number, building a strong foundation for the year ahead. Lessons have focused on whole number operations, fractions and decimals, and problem-solving strategies, helping students develop confidence in applying mathematical thinking to a variety of tasks. Through collaborative activities and independent practice, students are learning to explain their reasoning and approach math challenges with persistence and accuracy.



In Science, the year has begun with an important emphasis on laboratory safety. Students have learnt about safe behaviours in the lab, correct use of equipment, and how to follow safety procedures to ensure a safe learning environment for all. This foundational science knowledge and application of skill is essential as students begin hands-on investigations throughout the year. Students have been introduced to the fundamentals of Chemistry, including an exploration of basic laboratory equipment, making observations, and early ideas about matter and substances. Practical activities have sparked curiosity and enthusiasm, allowing students to experience science in an engaging and interactive way while developing key scientific skills. The lighting of Bunsen Burners being a real highlight.

It has been wonderful to see our Year 7 students approach their Maths and Science learning with curiosity, responsibility, and enthusiasm. We look forward to supporting their growth as they continue to develop their skills and understanding throughout the year.

ART EXCURSION TO THE NATIONAL GALLERY

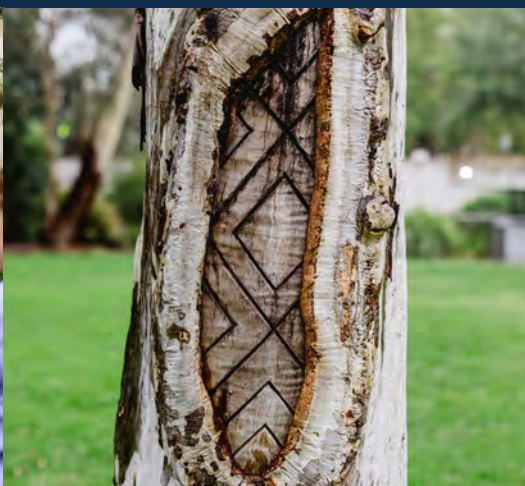
Finding their voice through art
